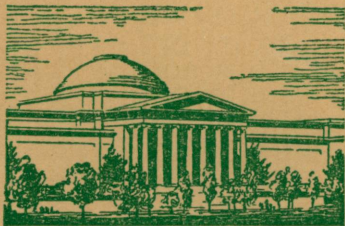

## EXHIBITIONS

The selection of French paintings and drawings on loan from the French Government will continue on view throughout January. These works of art have been familiar to Gallery visitors during the war period. This exhibition will probably be their last showing before they return to France.

## LECTURES

On January 27, Miss Elisabeth Puckett will lecture on "The Parisian Rebels of 1863," those young artists who refused to conform with the tradition of their day, and whose works were first assembled for public exhibition at the Salon des Refusés. Formerly a member of the Gallery's staff, Miss Puckett is at present doing independent research in this field on a Fellowship from the American Association of University Women.
