

DRESDEN SHOW TO OPEN IN NEW GALLERIES JUNE 1

The Splendor of Dresden: Five Centuries of Art Collecting, an exhibition from the German Democratic Republic, will be the first comprehensive loan exhibition to illustrate the history of art collecting, with the focus on Dresden's spectacular 500-year history of acquiring rare and beautiful objects. Among the more than 700 richly diverse works, which have been lent from the collections of the Staatliche Kunstsammlungen Dresden, will be old master paintings and drawings; Renaissance and baroque bronzes; decorated and jewelled arms and armor, pieces of silver, gold, and precious stones; vessels and utensils of rock crystal, pearl, ivory, coral, and rhinoceros horn set in sculpted gold mounts; rare oriental porcelain and extraordinary examples from the famed Meissen factories; antique sculpture; and nineteenth- and twentieth-century

35TH AMERICAN MUSIC FESTIVAL

This year's American Music Festival will be held each Sunday from April 9 through May 28 at 7 p.m. in the East Garden Court. Devoted entirely to works of American composers, the programs will feature world premieres and first Washington performances.

SYMPOSIA AT THE GALLERY

On Saturday, April 1, two symposia open to the public will be held in the Gallery Auditorium. From 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., art history graduate students will present papers on a variety of subjects based on original research, as part of the Middle Atlantic Symposium in the History of Art, sponsored by the University of Maryland. From 2 to 4 p.m., distinguished specialists will deliver talks on Giorgione and the culture of Renaissance Venice, celebrating the 500th anniversary of the great Venetian painter's birth.

The exhibition will be the first to be installed in the new East Building's special exhibition galleries, demonstrating the flexibility and capabilities of this space of more than 17,000 square feet.

This exhibition has been organized jointly by the National Gallery, the Metropolitan Museum of Art, and the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco. The exhibition is being made possible through a grant from the International Business Machines Corporation, with additional funding from the Robert Wood Johnson Jr. Charitable Trust, the National Endowment for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Humanities.

DUTCH PAINTING RECENTLY ACQUIRED

The National Gallery has acquired a major painting, View of Dordrecht, by Jan van Goyen, one of the most important landscape artists of the Dutch school. He initiated a period of landscape painting in the 1630s that captured the soft, atmospheric effects of land, sea, and sky. An extremely calm and peaceful picture, View of Dordrecht, which is

signed and dated 1644, is the first work by this artist to enter the Gallery's collection. Acquired through the Ailsa Mellon Bruce Fund, it is on view in gallery 49.




