The Housebook Master was one of the most delightful artists of the late Middle Ages. Rarely seen by the public in this century, the South German Housebook manuscript still belongs to the family of the Princes of Waldburg-Wolfegg. This exhibition of more than one hundred works is organized around various secular themes of medieval life and presents drawings from the Housebook, as well as the master's drypoints from the Rijksmuseum, Amsterdam; rare Gothic prints and drawings from the National Gallery of Art; and related artistic and utilitarian objects from other American collections.



Augustus Saint-Gaudens' Memorial to Robert Gould Shaw and the Massachusetts Fifty-Fourth Regiment

Created by Augustus Saint-Gaudens (1848–1907), this sculpture depicts Colonel Shaw and the first African American infantry unit from the North to fight for the Union during the Civil War. The work is on a ten-year-renewable loan from the National Park Service, Saint-Gaudens National Historic Site, Cornish, New Hampshire.

Edo: Art in Japan 1615–1868






